The participant completes the Yardstick per instructions. It is then mailed to or dropped off at the Extension Office.

The Yardstick is reviewed by Master Gardeners and the participant is contacted for follow up and a possible site visit.

A site visit is performed by Master Gardeners. Once the site evaluation is complete, the landscape is certified.

We are trained to evaluate properties using the Bay-Wise Yardstick:

- Make suggestions for environmentally sound landscapes
- Diagnose insect & disease problems
- Educate homeowners about the Chesapeake Bay & local waterways
- Discuss ways to reduce pollution from lawns & gardens
- Teach proper fertilization methods
- Share methods for restoring desirable wildlife habitats
- Explain the importance of healthy soil & how to achieve it
- Discuss easy-to-grow native & non-native plants versus invasive plants
- Help to develop plant lists

The Chesapeake Bay, its rivers and tributary streams play an important role in the lives of Marylanders. They provide us with food, recreation and commerce.

Our waterways are declining due, in part, to air pollution and to fertilizer and other pollutants running off homes and landscapes, farms, sewage treatment plants and industry.

Many Maryland residents live within a half-mile of a storm drain, stream or river. Most of these waterways eventually drain into the Chesapeake Bay.

What we do in our own yards affects the health of our local waterways, the Bay and the environment.

We all need to do our part to take care of our watershed. By changing a few simple practices, you and your family can help keep our Maryland water healthy.
